Approval of Minutes:

Rick Vierheller made a motion to approve the Safety Meeting Minutes of May 20, 2019, and the motion was seconded by Chair Leslie Miller. Two aye votes. Mrs. Frey abstained. The minutes were approved as written.

Mayor Carter spoke of her appreciation for the Police Department's hard work preparing for the yard sale and all they endured during the yard sale.

Chief's Report:

Chief Burson reported that all of the Seville Police Department Officers have served the community professionally and have all returned home safely.

Chief Burson reviewed statistics for May. There were 70 traffic offenses and crashes. The Department had 40 assists to BOPA, Fire and EMS. Seven alarms and 30 suspicious persons, cars or circumstances.

Three new felony and 26 misdemeanor offenses. There were 12 cleared adult arrests and one cleared juvenile arrest. Eleven traffic citations and four investigations still pending. The offenses are coming from residences of Akron, Chippewa Lake, Homerville, Fort Bend, and Seville.

The officers participated in Criminal Patrol, FST Training, Evidence Technician and Sex Offense Investigation training during the month of May.

Chief's Report (continued):

The major events in May include participation in the Memorial Day Parade. A traffic stop that lead to multiple drug charges. A drug investigation at Hawthorn Suites after white powder was left on a table. Assisted with an ongoing tenant dispute on East Main resulting in an eviction. Helped an intoxicated subject at El Patron who was threatening to harm herself. She was taken for evaluation. The officers helped with Safety Day at Cloverleaf. Officer Houck received a letter from the Montville Police Chief thanking him for his work on a case that he assisted with in May.

There were no significant issues reported during the 2019 Yard Sale. A Center Street resident reported the theft of a chain saw. The department gave only 2 parking citations any many warnings. Chief Burson heard ten compliments about the Department. Chief Burson complimented Officer Deal for his work in the 2019 yard Sale Planning. Officer Deal did the 2019 Incident Action Plan and led the pre-briefing meeting. Chief Burson said he is planning request for tools to use in the future to help with parking, enforcement, and sign issues. 27 man hours were used this year to set up parking restrictions.

Chief Burson said all cruisers have been outfitted with a water rescue throw bag. The bag includes 70 feet of nylon rope in a special bag that unfurls when thrown and can be used for people in distress.

Chief Burson said the new speed sign has been received and we are waiting on another part from the manufacturer.
