



**Safety Committee Meeting Minutes
Monday, November 18, 2019**

Call to Order:

Chair Leslie Miller called the meeting to order at 7:03 p.m.

Roll Call:

Present: Leslie Miller, Sue Frey and Rick Vierheller

Amendments to Agenda:

None.

Approval of Minutes:

Rick Vierheller made a motion to approve the Safety Minutes of October 21, 2019, and the motion was seconded by Sue Frey. Aye votes all. The minutes were approved as written.

Privilege of the Floor:

Chief's Report

Chief Burson reported that all of the Seville Police Department Officers have served the community professionally and have all returned home safely. Chief Burson reported there have been 207 police deaths in 2019.

Chief Burson reviewed statistics for October with a video presentation. The Department had 19 new offenses including 3 felony, 13 misdemeanors, and 3 unspecified traffic offenses. The significant offenses included assault and domestic violence.

Two officers participated in training for range and firearms and Law Enforcement Automated Data System. Chief Burson shared video of the firearm training.

Chief Burson listed major events in October included Halloween. The officers were in the park and traveling throughout the community. A World Truck driver was assaulted at the Robot Company by a delivery driver. A resident reported \$600 of fraudulent checks were written against his checking account. A resident was cited for allowing his dogs to run at large after several previous warnings. An arrest was made at the scene of a domestic violence incident.

Chief Burson congratulation Officer Nelson Kilgore for completing his six months of probation and doing an outstanding job. Chief Burson recommended he be removed from probation. Sue Frey made a recommendation to remove Officer Kilgore from probation and provide a level increase. Rick Vierheller seconded the motion. Aye votes all.

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Chief's Report (continued)

Chief Burson said the new cars are on track to be delivered in December. Equipment has been ordered. We are still waiting to hear from the Edward Byrne Memorial Justice Assistance Grant Program. Chief Burson said there are two options to be considered for selling the old police cars in February or March. They are considering regular advertising and using an internet service that is used for government entities.

New Business:

None.

Pending/Completed Legislation

Ordinance 2019-45 authorizing the Chief of Police to dispose of Village property no longer needed. Council passed November 12th.

Ordinance 2019-62 authorizing a contract with the highest and best bidder on the internet for the sale of Village property no longer needed (police cars). First reading was November 12th.

Old Business:

Chair Miller said the budget for 2020 is in progress we are still waiting for insurance expenses.

Privilege of the Floor:

Chair Miller noted the December 16th meeting may be cancelled.

Rick Vierheller made a motion to adjourn the meeting and Sue Frey seconded the motion. All were in favor. The meeting was adjourned at 7:16 p.m.
