



**Safety Committee Meeting Minutes

Call to Order:

Chair Leslie Miller called the meeting to order at 7:05 p.m.
The meeting was via conference call due to the COVID-19 Pandemic

Approval of Minutes:

Rick Vierheller made a motion to approve the Safety Minutes of April 20, 2020, and Brad Demiter seconded the motion. Two aye votes. Mr. Demiter abstained. The minutes were approved as written.

Chief's Report

Chief Burson reported that all of the Seville Police Department Officers have served the community professionally and have all returned home safely. Chief Burson said the department appreciates the Community's outstanding support in honor of Police Memorial Week.

Chief Burson said the department logged 3,123 activities. Ten of the activities were traffic related, being a traffic offense, parking offense or motor vehicle crash. Thirteen reported new offenses. The significant offenses were gross sexual imposition, weapons under disability, OVI and theft.

Chief Burson said there was no training to report for April.

Chief Burson said an Officer observed suspicious behavior at Circle K. The occupant admitted to being involved with a drug deal, the found a loaded 9mm in the vehicle. A Liberty Street resident reported an identity theft complaint involving his phone and bank account. An Oakwood resident reported a fraudulent check cashed on his account in Texas.

Chief Burson reported the Chevy Tahoes are being assembled by Hall's Public Safety. Chief Burson said they do a great job. The Dodge Chargers will be advertised for sale for ten days once the last Tahoe is assembled. There is a website in place with the details of each car. Sealed bids will be accepted for a certain time to be determined.

Mayor Carter asked if there has been a spike in domestic violence. Chief Burson said not at this time.

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New Business:

2020-09 - Ordinance for contract with Medina County Sheriff's Office for dispatch service. The ordinance was tabled on April 13th waiting for the invoice.

2020-22 - Amending Ordinance 2019-62 authorizing the Chief of Police to enter into a contract with the highest and best bidder on the internet for the sale of Village property no longer needed (cars). Council passed May 11th.
