Approval of Minutes:

New Business:

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Pending Legislation

2015-03 - an ordinance approving, adopting and enacting the 2015 edition of the model Ohio Municipal Code, published by the American Legal Publishing Corporation, for the Village of Seville Ohio; repealing ordinances in conflict therewith; and publishing the enactment of new matter. This Ordinance was passed by Council on March 9th.

2015-09 - an ordinance authorizing the mayor to enter into a contract with the Medina County Sheriff's office for dispatch services. The first reading is complete. The second reading was on March 9th. This has been tabled until the invoice is received.

Old Business:


