

**Safety Committee Minutes

Call to Order:

Chair Leslie Miller called the meeting to order at 6:33 p.m.

Pledge of Allegiance

Roll Call:

Approval of Minutes:

Kathy Rhoads made a motion to approve the minutes of July 23, 2014, with the noted correction that Mr. Barrington's vote should have been abstention. Leslie Miller seconded the motion. Two aye votes. Brad Demiter abstained. Minutes were approved with abstention clarification.

Chief's Report:

Chief Burson welcomed new Council Brad Demiter to the Committee. Chief Burson reported there were no uprisings since July. All the officers are back to health and the Department is back on schedule. Chief Burson noted that the newest officer, Adam Houck, is doing an absolutely great job and is further along in his training than anticipated.

Chief Burson reported the change of retired Prosecutor Shrock to the new Prosecutor Jason Wallace has been going smoothly. Mr. Wallace spent three hours getting to know the Department. Mr. Wallace has presented one case for The Village and won.

Chief Burson reported there is a Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) for the SWAT Team. This will clarify the confusion on scene of who remains under local control. To date the Sheriff has given approval and the final approval is anticipated by end of the year.

Officer Heidelman is still participating with OVI and Criminal Task Forces.

Chief Burson said that he has had several meetings about the Ebola outbreak. There are currently ten people in Medina being monitored. There are different categories of risk. Procedures are in place for first responders.

Chief's Report (continued):

Last month all of the officers received training in Wayne County for the Narcan drug.

Officer Earl Fockler will be setting a date for CPR training. The goal is to make CPR training available to all Village employees and eventually the public.

Chief Burson shared the Department has been busy with Run for the Trails and helping with school activities. Chief Burson shared that Bart Randolph expressed his appreciation to be able to have the Seville Police Department at the front doors at Cloverleaf's homecoming. The Safety Committee complimented the Department for their community involvement.

Chair Miller asked Chief Burson if there were any notes he would like to add about the 2015 budget. Chief Burson is asking for money to finish off the ATV project. There is currently over \$6,300 raised. Chief Burson would like to use some money to purchase equipment for the ATV. The goal is to have the ATV up and running for the 2015 Yard Sale. A citizen has donated a trailer to haul the ATV. There was a brief discussion about how useful the ATV will be with trails and crowds. Chair Miller reminded everyone to review the budget.

New Business:

The November and December meeting will be combined on Wednesday, 19th at 6:30 p.m. due to the holiday schedule.

Old Business:


The 2015 Safety Budget was discussed during the Chief Report.
