COUNCIL MINUTES

The meeting was called to order at 7:00 PM by Mayor Gene Sulzener followed by the pledge of allegiance.

Present-Mayor Gene Sulzener, Kathy Rhoads (arrived at 7:06), Barbara Schwartz, Larry Landis, Rick Stallard, Leslie Miller

Absent- Roger Kilgore

Judge Stephen McIlvaine from The Wadsworth Municipal Court gave his annual report. The report is available from the Fiscal Officer.

Mrs. Miller moved to table the minutes from January 23 pending a further review. The motion was seconded by Mrs. Rhoads. The motion passed unanimously.

Mrs. Schwartz moved to approve the minutes from February 11 with the amendment that the Street report was given by Mrs. Rhoads not Mrs. Schwartz. The motion was seconded by Mrs. Miller. The motion passed unanimously.

Mr. Stallard moved to approve the bills. The motion was seconded by Mr. Landis. The motion passed unanimously with the exception of Mrs. Schwartz who abstained.

Mrs. Miller nominated Richard Barbera to the vacant position on the Tax Appeal Board. The motion was seconded by Mrs. Rhoads. The motion passed unanimously.

Mrs. Schwartz, at the request of the solicitor, made a motion to give the unneeded name plates of Jennifer Hensal, Alicia Hathcock, and Gary Bowen to those individuals. The motion was seconded by Mrs. Miller. The motion passed unanimously.

Nancy Girton from the Medina County Auditor's Office updated Council. April 1st is the deadline to file with the Board of Revision to have real estate property values reappraised. This is a formal process and appointments are scheduled for hearings once the requests are submitted. There is also a less formal procedure available and information can be found on the Auditors' web-site.

The State of Ohio mandated appraisals are nearly complete. Values are trending downward by about 5%.

The Family Affair event will be held on April 27th. The will be activities for children under the age of 10.

Privilege of the floor:

John Clevidence updated Council on the status of a citizens group wishing to purchase an All Terrain Vehicle for the Police Department. The group has not raised enough funds to this point. Another spaghetti dinner fund raiser is being planned.

Village resident and BOPA President Kieran O'Rourke spoke about BOPA resolution 2013-01 and the proposal to return the Kilo Watt Hour Tax to the residents of Seville. He gave a history of how and why the tax was created and how Seville has handled the tax in the past. From 2000 until 2007 Seville returned the tax to the rate-payers which is what most other government entities do. Because of financial issues, beginning in 2007, the entire amount of tax collected with exception of the amount paid by BleachTech

Corporation was left in the General Fund to cover village expenses. This was understood to be a temporary situation. Mr. O'Rourke felt that with the improved finances of the village as noted in the Mayor's State of the Village address, it was no longer necessary for the money to be kept in the General Fund and should be returned to the rate-payers. BOPA passed resolution 2013-01 urging Council to return the tax. There is a resolution on the Council agenda tonight proposing the return of the tax. The amount of tax would be equal to a 2.2 mil levy. He noted that BOPA would not keep the returned tax but it would be returned to the customers. He also pointed that the large balances in BOPA funds should be considered capital reserves rather than just straight carry-overs. The balances are certified during the State of Ohio's audited and in some cases, required by American Municipal Power Inc. which is the Villages' electric supplier. The large balances allow BOPA to buy power at reduced rates in some cases and also cover the expenses for the electric fund which can be as much as \$600,000 per month. Mr. O'Rourke said that he was trying to point out what the Council's options were. He further noted that Council has done nothing illegal in keeping a portion of the tax and can continue to keep the tax despite the BOPA resolution. He also said that Council has other means to increase revenues including levies.

Solicitor's Report-Ted Lesiak is now with the firm Roderick Linton Belfance LLP and introduced Brandon Pauley as his assistant in dealing with village legal issues.

A committee needs to be formed to take the lead on promoting the levies for the November election. Mrs. Schwartz urged action on this issue.




Mayor Sulzener reported that he will be attending the meetings of the Chamber of Commerce on March 14th and the Kiwanis Club on March 27th.

In 2012, Other Traffic had a noticeable increase and Misdemeanors a slight increase. OVI's and Felonies had decreases.




In 2012, there was a significant decrease in Personal Injury, Evictions and Small Claims; and, significant increase in Other Civil and a slight decrease in Contracts.

NEW CASES FILED


2012 Cases - Traffic and Criminal

2012 - New Cases - Civil







