Chief's Report:

Chief Burson reported that all of the Seville Police Department Officers have served the community professionally and have all returned home safely. Officer Houck attended Honor Guard training. Officer Deal attended the Reed School of Interview and Interrogation training. Officer Deal will be attending the Data Master training in mid-April. Two officers assisted the Kiwanis for kindergarten registration. This day is enjoyed by all and allows for a positive interaction with the children and police officers.

Chief Burson reported he was asked to serve a two year term on the Communications Board and he accepted.

Chief Burson said the department has been involved in meetings for the schools' safety and security since the Florida shootings. The local police departments have been asked to double down efforts on availability for parking lots and walking in the school. Chief Burson asked for the Committee's blessing to continue helping the schools. The Committee responded "Absolutely".

Chief's Report (continued):

Chief Burson said there have been one assault, 2 thefts and 70 traffic related incidents, 11 assists to citizens and 32 assists to Fire and EMS. Two missing persons, 2 vandalisms, and 19 assist to other agencies. Year-To-Date 74 offenses reported to the department and 74 percent of the people involved with the reports have been from out of town. Sixty percent were male and 40% were women. Thirteen percent were in single family homes and 12 % in multifamily/rental properties.

Chair Miller stated the Easter Egg Hunt will be Saturday, March 24<sup>th</sup>, 1 PM, at Cy Hewit Park.
